Reports: Bon Secours HCA	Mike Harmon – St. Marys received the Comprehensive Stroke Certification from AHA and The Joint Commission and also received their award from AHA for Mission Lifeline Silver Plus. Gary Samuals – Henrico Doctors Hospital is officially a Level II Trauma Center and is now receiving trauma patients.	



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CJW	<p>Brad Taylor – A CEU dinner at Chippenham is being held on 7/26/2016 and he invited everyone to come. Chippenham had their consultative ACS Trauma Review and it went well, they have set the date for the actual review.</p> <p>Ken Smith – The helipad at Johnston Willis has been delayed 90 days due to a citizen having a concern over increased air traffic. The Board of Supervisors meets this upcoming week and they do not anticipate any problems having the helipad approved. A tentative date for August 1st was set for construction to begin. In September, some medical office buildings outside of ODEMSA are scheduled to be torn down. Active shooter training and breach entry training with Chesterfield Police, Chesterfield Fire and EMS, and State police are going to be scheduled inside the empty buildings before they are removed.</p>	
Halifax Regional	Brian Epperson – No report.	
VCU	<p>Erin Nowlin – An active shooter exercise is planned for VCU Police at the University on August 3, 2016.</p> <p>Robin Manke – Robin wanted to remind everyone that there is a scheduled protest on 7/23/16, going from Browns Island to the Capital with an expected participation of 450. If there is an incident that occurs the ODEMSA MCI plan will be enacted. There will also be extra security around VCU.</p>	
VA Dept. of Health	James Moss – Henrico Health Group had their ESFA meeting the past week and there is a need in Henrico County for a MCI workshop. VDH and the Healthcare Coalition will be meeting next week to draft up an agenda and identify some speakers, time frame looks like late August or early September.	
RHCC	Andrew Slater – The Coalition has been involved with the planning for the VP debate to be held at Longwood University and will be employing a STIP with Centra and Medical Reserve Corp staff, working it. There will also be a Healthcare Coalition desk in the Longwood EOC. A training weekend will be held in August and the actual event will begin with a concert (with a limited attendance of 5,000) on 10/2 and the debate is scheduled on 10/4.	



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<p>ODEMSA</p>	<p>Heidi Hooker – Heidi introduced Megan Young as the new Program Coordinator for the committee meetings. The ODEMSA accreditation process to be a Regional Council with the Commonwealth was on 7/12/2016 and it went very well, they do not expect any problems. The Regional Awards Picnic is on August 6, 2016 at the Richmond Zoo, all are welcome and invited. Megan and Heidi went to RHCC for a walkthrough of how their systems work and thanked Andrew Slater. Damien the Field Coordinator Rep for Areas 15 and 19 has been attending a lot of meetings and planning for the Longwood University VP Debate.</p>	
<p>Chesterfield Fire and EMS</p>	<p>Allen Yee – Call volumes in Chesterfield have continued to increase. In April of 2017 Chesterfield has a reverse MDS drill planned with the hospitals. A few days prior Chesterfield will roll call the hospitals and decide what patients need to be transferred out of the region and do a paper trail on getting the simulated patients to the airport. Chesterfield’s active shooter training and policies using the RTF module has gone very well and they will continue to monitor it for any new changes or updates.</p>	
<p>RAA</p>	<p>Brian McRay – Brian wanted to remind everyone that with the possible nomination of Tim Kaine as Hillary Clintons Vice President the political campaigning in central Virginia will increase beyond normal. He stated that it isn’t just an active shooter we should focus on but also the “normal” such as a person driving a truck into crowds that we should plan for. He also warned people of a protest event being held at pump and broad on 7/23/2016.</p>

Gray stated CVHC has the funding for the triage tags.</p> <p>Hospital Evacuation Plan – Robin Manke stated Erin Nowlin has been working on an evacuation committee with VCU health to train on new and old equipment including med slides. Erin stated VCU has a subcommittee with fire and life safety that does fire evacuations and have been training with them on non-fire evacuation needs. Gray Corbett stated CVHC has bought four medical slides for each of the 52 long term care facilities and is having Chris Miller come down and provide training at the facilities. It was brought up that this plan needs to be focused on, especially in relation to EMS, Brian McRay volunteered to be the head of this workgroup along with Gray Corbett.</p>	
<p>WebEOC Changes</p>	<p>Status of WebEOC Changes – Andrew Slater reported the user interface updates are going into production within the next few months. Regarding its implications for the hospital level of ED bed reporting for MCI events, not much will change regarding notifications.</p>	
<p>CHEMPACK Annex</p>	<p>James Moss stated he will work in the upcoming months on meeting with those who are on the workgroup in late August or early September. Gray Corbett stated they will be practicing with at least two other hospitals and with the EMS agencies in that area in the next 6 months on CHEMPACK deployment and will report on how it went next meeting.</p>

<p>Recent MCI's</p>	<p>No recent MCIs to report. Andrew Slater stated that during the severe June thunderstorms seven hospitals went on generator power and Parham Doctors Hospital called the RHCC activation hotline to report their generator that supports the ER and ICU was failing. RHCC was able to deploy generators to their hospital.</p>	
<p>TEMS Report</p>	<p>Erin Nowlin reported on the E3 Tornado that went through Essex County on February 24, 2016 with about 28 miles of damage. She stated there was 25 patients that needed to be transported out of the area from Riverside Tappahannock. The Eastern Virginia Hospital Coalition reached out to RHCC and VCU took Medical Control to help disperse</p>	



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	<p>those patients. There was an April After Action Meeting to see where improvement could be made between the two regions. It was requested ODEMSA share their MCI plan with the Eastern Virginia Hospital Coalition. There were also some internal processes put in place including education about the different levels of diversion such as Med/Surg VS full hospital diversion. Some EMS transport groups in the EVHC were confused as to what hospitals were accepting what. 2-1-1 activation was also looked at in the meeting and a report was created by that After Action Meeting which Erin said will be dispersed soon.</p> <p>There was no further business from the floor.</p>
